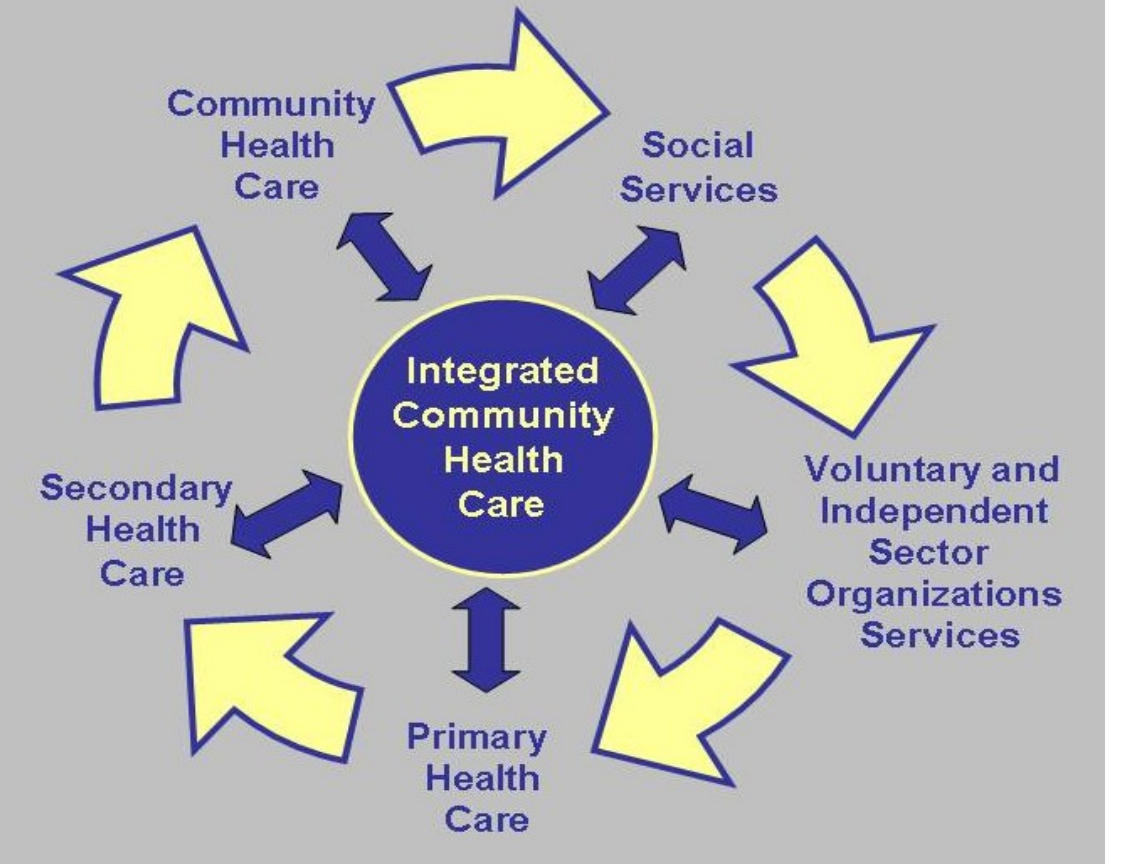

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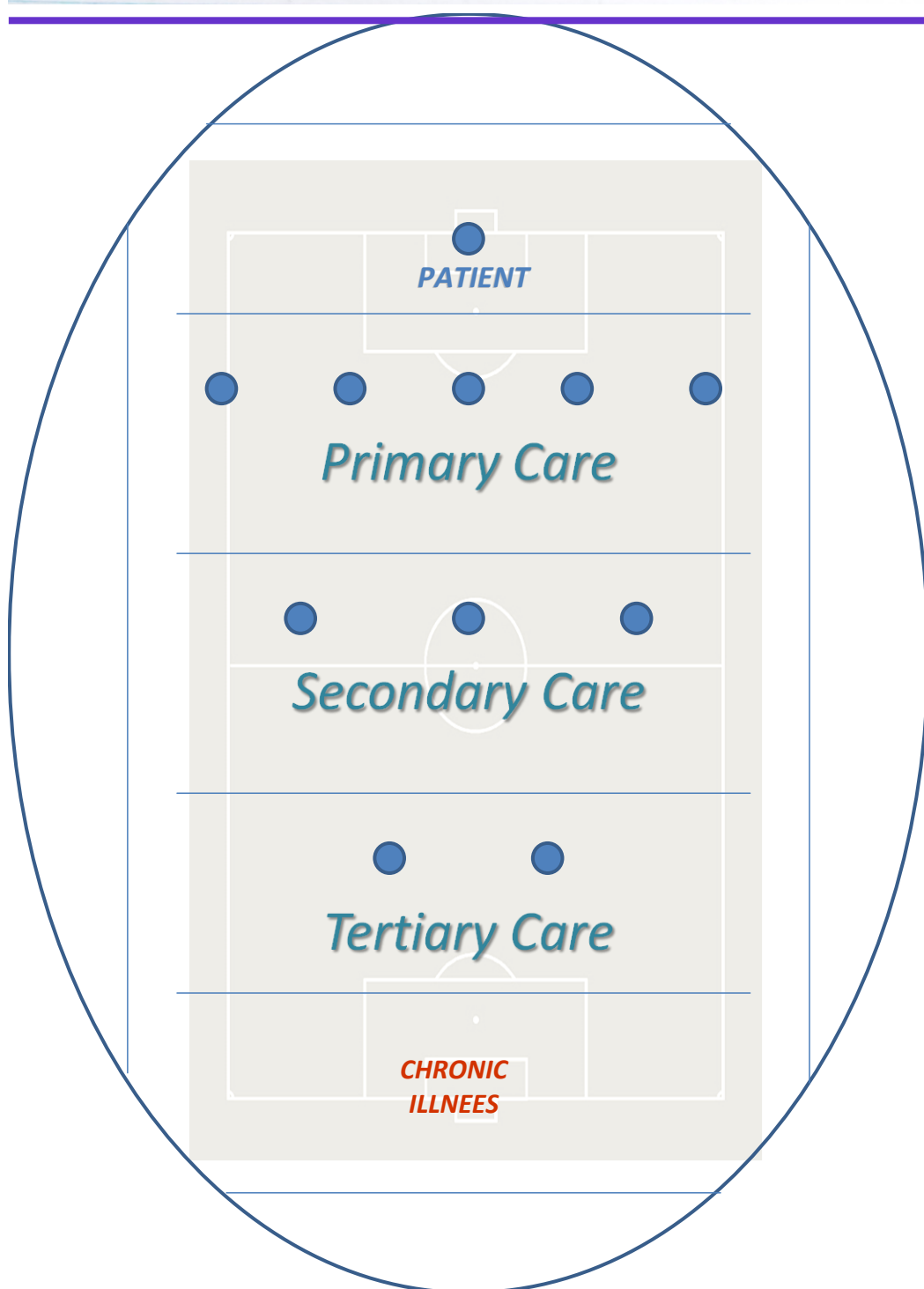


A six-week course for anyone living with any long term conditions. Help patients to take more control of their health by learning new skills to manage their condition better on a daily basis.

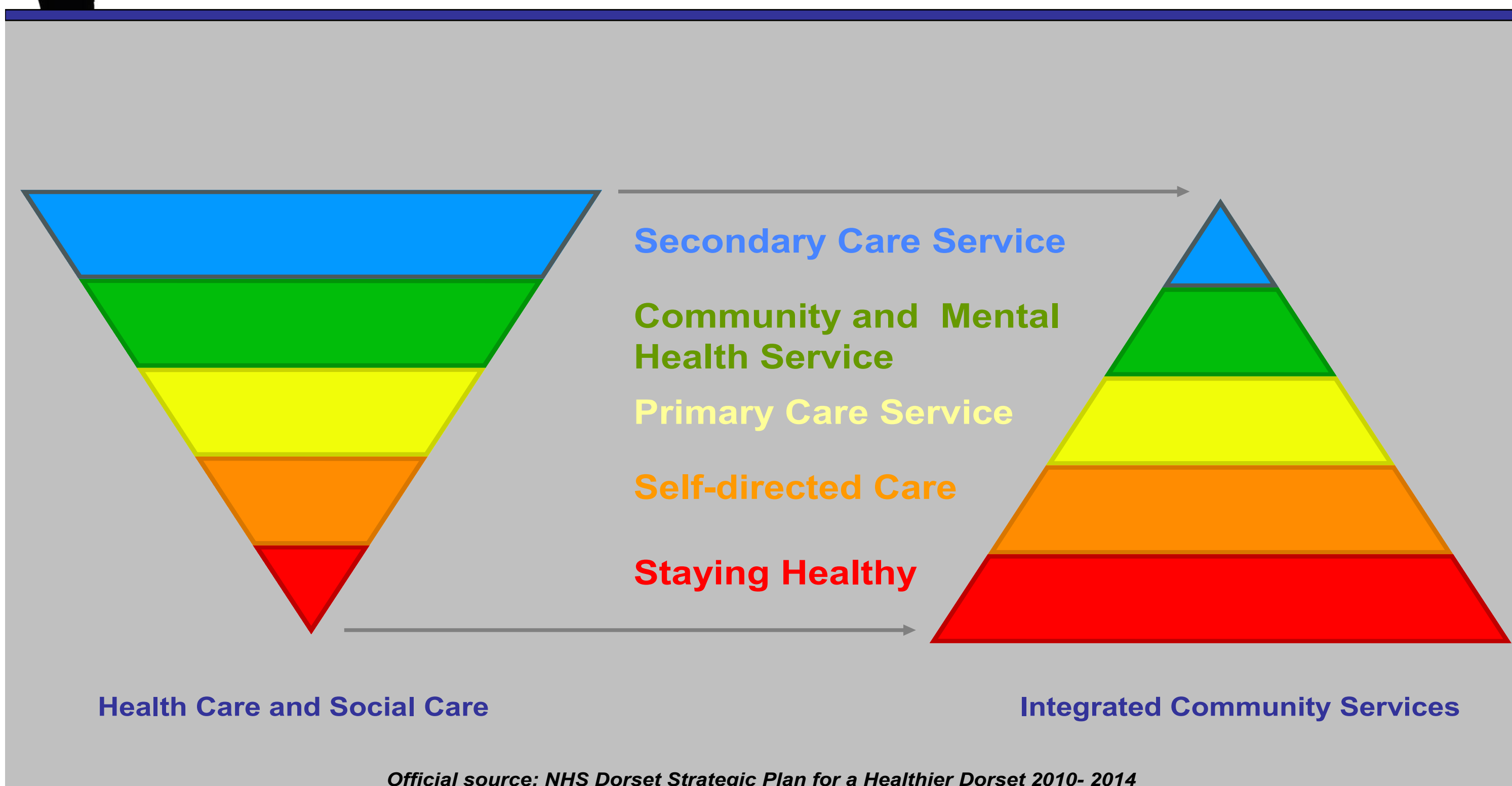
