
ACUTE CARE HOSPITAL ADMISSIONS PER 100 POPULATIONS

In 2011, the 28 European Member States of the European Union have registered on average 15,8 admissions in acute care hospitals every 100 inhabitants.

However, this ranged between Austria (25,8 admissions per 100 inhabitants) and Cyprus (8,9 admissions per 100 inhabitants).

Between 2000 and 2011, the average rate of acute care admissions in the European Member States dropped off by about 1 unit. It decreased by 0,7 unit in 'EU15' and by 1,6 units in 'EU13'.

The major decreases were registered in Latvia (-4,6), Hungary (-4,4), and Italy (-4,2). The higher increases were registered in Germany (+2,4), the Netherlands (+2,6) and Greece (+3,7).
