
HEALTH PROFESSIONALS' PROFILE

PHYSICIANS AND NURSES PER 100.000 POPULATIONS

Between 2000 and 2011, the European Union had a total of 1.645.000 physicians and 3.770.000 nurses with a more or less stable rate of 2,3 nurses per each doctor, as illustrated by the dotted line in the chart above.

In 2011, the **number of physicians per 100.000 inhabitants** in the European Union was on average 346, ranging between 219 in Poland and 612 in Greece.

The average number of nurses per 100.000 inhabitants was 836, encompassed between 354 in Greece and 1.585 in Belgium.

In 2011, the number of physicians per 100.000 inhabitants in 'EU13' was 34% smaller than the number of physicians in 'EU15'. The number of nurses per 100.000 inhabitants in 'EU13' was 39% smaller than in 'EU15'.

Between 2000 and 2011, the **number of physicians per 100.000 inhabitants** in the **28 European Member States** increased on average by 20,3%. In 'EU15' it increased by 24,4% in ten years, in 'EU13' instead, by about 5,1% (it increased until 2004, then it started dropping off and since 2005 it increased again).

The number of **nurses per 100.000 population** increased on average by 8,4% in the **28 European Member States**.

• United Kingdom: +42%

from 196 in 2000 to 278 in 2011

• Greece: +41%,

from 433 in 2000 to 612 in 2011

 Luxembourg: +29%, from 214 in 2000 to 276 in 2011

 Portugal +29%, from 310 in 2000 to 398 in 2011

 Austria: +26%, from 381 in 2000 to 478 in 2011

Most relevant decreases

 Slovakia: -7%, from 323 in 2000 to 300 in 2011

Poland: -2%, from 222 in 2000 to 219 in 2011

- Luxembourg: +54%
 from 756 in 2000 to 1.163 in 2011

- **Greece**: +21%, from 293 in 2000 to 354 in 2011
- Germany: +18%,

from 978 in 2000 to 1.154 in 2011

- → Slovakia: -12%, from 748 in 2000 to 661 in 2011
- Lithuania: -8%, from 802 in 2000 to 736 in 2011
